

## **Instructions for proving your Language Proficiency - Master of AIRE**

**English proficiency:** Proficiency in English is mandatory as all courses are conducted in English, B2 level is expected. Official English Language Certificates, such as IELTS Academic, TOEFL, Cambridge English Qualifications, Pearson Test of English, Duolingo English Test, or CEFR-based certificates, are required.

In the absence of an official language certificate, applicants may provide one of the following:

- An official statement from a higher education institution confirming that all or part of the applicant's studies were conducted in English (EMI - English as a Medium of Instruction)
- You do not need the certification if you come from a country where English is the official language or if your high school/secondary education was mainly in English. In this case, you can add a document issued by your institution stating that.

**French proficiency:** French is not required for admission. An A1 level is indicated as a reference to show basic familiarity and interest in the language, but it is not a blocking criterion. Please note that French is strongly recommended, ideally A1-A2 level. Given the compulsory internships throughout the program, students are encouraged to develop and strengthen their French skills. It is essential to reach an A2 level in French by the second year to increase your opportunities.

For applicants without formal certification, the following alternatives may be considered:

- Proof of enrolment in a French language course (university, Alliance Française, or other recognized institution)
- An official statement from a higher education institution confirming that all or part of the applicant's studies were conducted in French.
- You do not need the certification if you come from a country where French is the official language or if secondary education / high school was completed mainly in French. In this case, you can add a document stating that.
